

RSGB Construction Competition 2025

The RSGB has launched its Construction Competition for 2025. Entries to this annual competition will again be judged online to allow RSGB members from the UK and across the world to participate and demonstrate their creativity.


In line with the Society's strategic priority of growth, there will be a new Outreach category this year in which members are encouraged to submit a project that can be reproduced in a school or public environment.

The other five categories are beginners, construction excellence, innovation, software and antennas.

A cash prize will be awarded for the winner of each section, with a bonus for the overall winner, who will also be declared the winner of the Pat Hawker G3VA Award. The winner of the beginner category will also receive the Gavin Nesbitt, MM1BXF trophy.

The results of the competition will be announced during the 2025 RSGB Annual General Meeting in April.

Goyder-Bell centenary celebrations

On Friday 18 October the RSGB, Mill Hill School and a team of radio amateurs in New Zealand took part in a special celebration to mark the centenary of the first successful two-way trans-global communication between radio amateurs



in the UK and New Zealand. The original contact between Frank Bell, 4AA in New Zealand and Cecil Goyder, 2SZ in Mill Hill School in North London was re-enacted at the school on a wavelength as close as possible to the original. Members of Goyder's family watched the re-enactment and chatted to pupils.

As part of wider celebrations for the day, the school put on activities including a build-a-radio workshop. Students at the school showed significant interest in amateur radio, with a number of students signing up to be part of a new radio club that will be set up by the school's physics teacher.

The overall event was led by RSGB Life Vice-President Don Beattie, G3BJ who said that he was delighted by the success of the event and that it had given pupils the opportunity to learn how ground-breaking that first radio contact was with New Zealand. Call sign G2SZ was operational for four days surrounding the centenary, during which operators achieved approximately 1,250 contacts.

- 1. The last date you can take an exam at a club, whether online or on paper, is Friday 13 December
- 2. If you want to take an exam online at home, the last date you can do that is Friday 20 December

The RSGB Exams Team will, where possible, post out exam results before HQ shuts over Christmas and New Year. Exams will resume on Monday 6 January 2025 and the booking system will be available over the festive season so you can book exams for January onwards. This month's card from Michael, N1EN brought a wry smile. It's a deceptively simple piece of artwork, that says a lot. Perhaps it's a tongue in cheek comment on modern amateur radio. Maybe it's about how those closest to us see us or maybe the rest of the world, who knows. A solitary figure alone in a darkened room, probably in the watches of the night, staring at a wide screen, in a world of his/her own and oblivious to everything else including the desperate cat. Today screens and data modes dominate whilst equipment gets smaller but the classic key and doublet remain. A fun card!

Newark Hamfest

At the recent show it was pleasing to see quite a few visitors taking note of the QSL sub-managers' details. In the past many wrote the details down on cards that we provided. This year, almost all took a photograph of the details on their phone with comments such as: "Must send some envelopes, haven't sent envelopes for years, suppose I should" or, "I wonder if my sub manager has any cards or envelopes for me?"

Of course, sub-managers are only obliged to keep uncollected cards for 90 days, where no envelopes are available. However, some are kind enough to wait a little longer but only if they have space and know their users. As for wondering if the sub-manager has any cards, please remember that the rules are such that volunteers 'send-all-send-any' if envelopes are to hand.

Sadly, there's been another price hike on first-class stamps. All the more reason to follow the guidelines and use only second-class stamps on your C5 collection envelopes.

European Holidays

During the summer months most of Europe is on holiday. Whilst this is great for portable activities and special events it means that as we move into autumn the incoming numbers of cards slows. This year is looking quieter than usual, meaning that the most recent despatch to our network has been the smallest of the year, so far. However, things tend to pick up as many get back into the shack and catch up on the summer back log. Incoming often peaks around December/ January time.



DXpeditions

DXpeditions attract a lot of attention on the bands at any time of the year but more so around the time of the annual CQ WorldWide SSB & CW contests at the end of October and November. Often remote stations will also activate a location just prior to and sometimes after the contest. Of course, there are lots of DX-cluster web sites that provide near real-time and frequency details stations on-line. If you're starting out on the DX trail other sites give details in advance of activations allowing you chances to be pre-warned. Here's a few to help check for those rare locations and call signs.

Many of these activations produce stunning QSL cards that are a delight to own. However, don't rely on sending your card via the bureau system. By their very nature DX locations simply don't have a bureau that we can send to. In many cases these days adding a visa to the operator's call doesn't work either. DXpeditions cost money and it's now commonplace to request a small payment to subsidise costs (we don't accept or forward money with cards). If you want a real card for your collection or to impress your friends, you must check the expedition web page before doing anything, to avoid disappointment.

RSGB National Radio Centre at Bletchley Park

Volunteers at the RSGB National Radio Centre (NRC) were pleased to welcome Becky, NOUFO and her partner Benjiman, who is a former US Marine Corps and retired professional radio operator. Becky is a member of Central Ohio ARRL emergency network responders and an Ohio extreme weather spotter.

RSGB National Radio Centre volunteer, and newly appointed STEM Ambassador, Fadel, MOSFD recently helped a student make a QSO to an Italian station using the Flex6600 radio on the 20m band. The group of students were visiting from London and were all eager to learn more about amateur radio. There are now 12 volunteers who have become STEM ambassadors at the RSGB National Radio Centre.

The initial draft version of the Guide for Visually Impaired at the RSGB National Radio Centre is now in a spiral bound copy with a laminated front and back cover. This guide covers the displays in the NRC Reception area. A second, separate, guide is now being worked on to cover the Time-Line display in the NRC.

The NRC will be hosting the GB24YOTA callsign as part of YOTA month on the weekend of 14-15 December. The volunteers will welcome any young people who would like to get on the air during the weekend. Remember that you will still need to pay to access Bletchley Park Museum unless you are an RSGB member and download a free entry voucher from the Members' web portal.

We are delighted that December's Build-a-Radio workshops at the RSGB National Radio Centre at Bletchley Park have both now sold out. The event offers young people the opportunity to learn more about amateur radio and electronics. FM radio kits are provided free of charge by the Radio Communications Foundation. Enigma Reloaded

The eighth annual Enigma Reloaded event took place at the RSGB National Radio Centre at Bletchley Park in October. A team of six National Radio Centre Morse volunteers monitored both the 40m and 20m bands throughout the day, listening for a Morse transmission from the amateur radio club of the Italian Naval College. The originating transmission was sent to museums around the world and consisted of a message that had been previously encrypted using Enigma.

Having acknowledged receipt of the transmission, the message was then passed over to the Bletchley Park Learning Team Manager who invited visitors to step forward and punch the characters of the encrypted message onto the keyboard of a genuine WWII Enigma machine. Visitors were delighted to watch the originating plain text message appear after being decrypted.

Ofcom licensing framework update

Ofcom has notified stakeholders that the next release of its licensing service will be delayed due to issues that have arisen during software development. According to the Ofcom website, delays have impacted Phases 2 and 3 of the planned changes to the amateur radio licensing framework. Phase 2 includes changes to new Intermediate callsigns, special event station rules and restrictions on the number of callsigns an individual may hold. Distance Learning for Intermediate Exam

The Bath Based Distance Learning team (BBDL) has helped well over a thousand students to pass UK amateur radio exams with pass rates consistently above the national average. Every student that completed the last Intermediate course passed the exam. The next BBDL Intermediate course will run from January to May 2025. Students will receive weekly work packages via a virtual classroom. There will be weekly on-line tutorials and revision quizzes. Students will also have access to one of the BBDL remote tutors who will provide feedback and additional guidance when required. There will be practical exercises to bring the theory to life. Students will be expected to do the exercises at home and report their results. There are a number of revision crossword puzzles, and progress checks spaced throughout the course, and at the end of the course there will be a number of mock exams. There will be no charge for the training but students will need to provide their own textbook, scientific calculator, electronic parts and tool kit. Students will also have to arrange their own exam at the end of the course, but advice will be provided at the appropriate time. As part of the application process, there will be some pre-course work to ensure students are able to use our online learning systems and to be sure they are ready to study in January.

Another BBDL course for the Full Licence will follow on from the Intermediate course, running from August to December. A further announcement will be made when that course is ready for enrolment. However, we are encouraging all those who intend to study for the Full Licence and passed the Intermediate exam before September 2019 to join our Intermediate course. This will provide good revision and bridge the gaps created by syllabus changes in 2019, 2022 and 2024.

GB2ZL contact between Inverness and New Zealand

part of the celebrations to mark the centenary of the world's first transglobal two-way radio communication, special callsign GB2ZL has been active at times from the UK. This is in addition to the main UK activity from GB2NZ, G2SZ and others. On Tuesday 15 October, the GB2ZL station, operated by Chris. GM3WOJ from near Inverness, a remarkable QSO with the ZL4AA team located just North of Dunedin. The ZL4AA station



was operated by Dave ZL4DK, Mike ZL4OL and Stephen ZL4BN. This QSO, on the 40m band long path at 0721UTC, was made using CW. There were 559 reports exchanged each way. The operators at both ends were thrilled to make this contact. At each end of the QSO was an 80-year-old all-valve military transceiver from New Zealand, an iconic ZC1. Worked All Britain (WAB) Winter Activity Award

Over the winter period, a special award is available. Contacts for this award must be made between 1 December and the last day of February the following year, all during the same winter period.

Points are awarded as follows:

- 2 points for each square
- 5 points for each trig point
- 5 points for each WAB member
- 10 points for each island
- 10 points for each large square

For this award, a member can only be claimed once, regardless of how many book numbers they hold.

For UK HF: 200 points are required for the basic certificate; endorsements are then available for each additional 200 points up to 1800, after which a new certificate will be issued at the cost of an endorsement.

For Europe HF: 100 points are required for the basic certificate. Endorsements are then available for each additional 100 points up to 900, after which a new certificate will be issued at the cost of an endorsement.

For VHF, outside Europe HF and data modes (any band): 50 points are required for the basic certificate. Endorsements are then available for each additional 50 points up to 450, after which a new certificate will be issued at the cost of an endorsement.

For activating: 50 points are required for the basic certificate. Endorsements are then available for each additional 50 points up to 450, after which a new certificate will be issued. Awards claimed for activating are not charged. Activators can also claim points for the members that they work during their activations. They may be claimed once only during the award period, irrespective of how many activations they are worked from.

It then changed its name in 1978 to reflect the growing ecumenical

nature of its membership and became WACRAL.

As Christian radio amateurs, the association was delighted to be issued with the more modern callsign M1CRA which can often be found on the air with WACRAL nets and special events.

Whether you are a radio amateur or listener, you are very welcome to listen to or contact WACRAL members on the air or the M1CRA station when it is operating.

Six Metre Group Winter Marathon



Visitors to the Yorkshire Wolds Railway came along to have a look and listen to the radio station after their visit to view the displays and history of the Fimber Halt railway and a train ride on Eddie, a diesel-hydraulic 5576 0-4-0 shunter built in 1979.

A total of 51 contacts were made on the radio with 17 heritage railways contacted. Other railway enthusiasts called in from around the UK and Europe including Holland and Belgium.

All in all, a splendid weekend with excellent hospitality from the volunteer staff of Yorkshire Wolds Railway. HARC will be back next year to celebrate the 200th anniversary of steam railways.


